Action: Upon motion of Mr. Gaines, seconded by Ms. Cohen and unanimously carried, Mr. Vazquez, Mr. Schaefer, Mr. Gaines, Ms. Cohen and Ms. Stowers voting yes, the Board directed issuance of an advisory Letter to Assessors (LTA) to encourage County Assessors to accept electronic signatures in lieu of wet signatures.

Members indicated that the working group would include discussion of section 170.

Action: Ms. Cohen moved to schedule an additional Board Meeting in two or three weeks to consider any short-term actions as determined by the working group. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gaines. Ms. Cohen offered an amendment that would leave the additional meeting date open for more flexibility. The amended motion was seconded by Ms. Stowers and unanimously carried, Mr. Vazquez, Mr. Schaefer, Mr. Gaines, Ms. Cohen and Ms. Stowers voting yes.
